The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) is a voluntary organization through which the nation's colleges and universities govern their athletics programs. It is comprised of institutions, conferences, organizations and individuals committed to the best interests, education and athletic participation of student-athletes.

The NCAA has 3 Divisions, each with a minimum number of teams, competitions, and squad sizes specified and maximum scholarship amounts. Rules differ for each Division.

Over 1000 colleges and universities make up the membership, organized in more than 100 conferences.

NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE

The NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse is an organization that works with the NCAA to determine a student's eligibility for athletics participation in his or her first year of college enrollment.



ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

*Students must complete the appropriate core curriculum as set by the clearing house for each Division (I or II).

Division 1

- +English (4 years required)
- +Math (3 years required)
- +Natural/physical science (2 years required)
- +Social Science (2 years required)
- +Additional academic courses (4 years required)

Division II

- +English (3 years required)
- +Math (2 years required)
- +Natural/physical science (2 years required)
- +Additional year in English, math or natural/physical science (2 years required)
- +Social science (2 years required)
- +Additional academic courses (3 years required)

Division III does not use the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse. Contact your Division III college regarding its policies.

Q. Why?

If you intend to participate in Division I or II athletics as a college freshman, you must be registered with and be certified as eligible by the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse. Please note that initial eligibility certification pertains only to whether you meet the NCAA requirements for participation as a freshman in Division I or II athletics and has no bearing on your admission to a particular Division I or II school.
